

Community-wide SD Competition - Proposal

Objectives

At the EPSC meeting held on 19 October 2004, Members agreed that community-wide competitions could help raise awareness of SD and should be included an additional education and publicity initiatives to be implemented in 2005. In view of this, we propose to launch a competition with the aims of –

- enhancing public awareness and understanding of the principles of SD and encouraging the public to put these into practice;
- building capacity for future engagement in SD Strategy building campaigns; and
- creating networks in the community for involvement in future SD activities.

Target Groups

We propose that there be three categories of entrant, namely: school students, tertiary education students and the general public. Each contesting team can comprise more than one member. For each category, we propose three distinction and three merit awards.

Duration

April – July 2005 (from invitation for applications to prize-giving ceremony).

Partners

Stakeholder organisations, such as NGOs, District Councils and business groups are potential collaborators in co-organising the competition.

Content

Entrants would be required to produce educational publicity material in the form of a poster, a short video, a pamphlet or any other type of publicity vehicle that would help the public to understand the principles of SD and encourage them to put these into practice in their daily lives. About one

month would be given to the participants to prepare their entries. The competition would conclude with a public prize-giving ceremony at which the award winning entries would be shown. The winning entries could also be used in presentations or education programmes organized by the SDU, such as the School Outreach Programme.
